

"You Are Sooooo Loved"

For the believer, our experience with our heavenly Father is a love fueled story from beginning to end. It begins as Psalm 139 teaches at conception in our mothers' womb: "For you created my inmost being; you knit me together in my mothers womb. I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made." Our love-fueled relationship with our heavenly Father begins in utero and it reaches its crescendo in the place where Jesus died. John 3:16 says – "For God so loved the world, that He gave His one and only Son that whoever believes in Him will not perish but will have everlasting life."

The verb here in the first half of this verse is <u>loved</u> and the adverb is <u>so</u> which is emphatic. The verse could have read: "For God loved the world" without adding the emphasis of the adverb so. Why did God use such a potent little description like so? Why did He give one of His most definitive proclamations of His love through a little adverb? Why, because God was trying to get through to us. God doesn't merely love us. He <u>so</u> loved us.

This is not some kind of contractual, obligatory, perfunctory love. It is an emphatic love. God soooooo loved you that He gave His one and only Son. God values us that much! Do you realize that the six hours when Jesus hung on the cross says more about you than all the other hours of history put together. The cross says without a shadow of doubt: "God Loves You!"

Praise to God for a Living Hope

1 Peter 1:3-4

"Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! In his great mercy he has given us new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, and into an inheritance that can never perish, spoil or fade."

Phil Wickham, the singer songwriter who has released contemporary Christian staples like "Great Are You Lord" and "This is Amazing Grace," is the author of our Easter choir number, "Living Hope." It began as a collaboration between he and Bethel music's Brian Johnson, put together over hundreds of text messages that began with Johnson's simple tune for the now verse and the phrase, Living Hope. As they continued to write this back and forth, the emphasis became the Gospel and especially the third verses articulate and picturesque rendering of the resurrection; "...out of the silence, the Roaring Lion, declared the grace has no claim on me!"

Have you ever really stopped to think about the fact that the hope we have in Jesus life, death and resurrection is a LIVING HOPE!??? It is not a hope in the past, or even just in the future! It is not a hope that can be squashed or stopped (that wouldn't really be Hope now would it?). It is not a hope that could suffer diminishment, let alone some kind of human caused death. Our Hope in this life, as well as the life to come, is as certain and eternal as the resurrected Life of Jesus Christ! This Hope has always been, it is daily present with us now, and will lead us to and keep us in the life to come! Jesus is alive, and therefore so also our Hope!

To often in this life we lose hope or find it evasive because we are looking for hope in all the wrong places; a relationship, new job, better social or economic standing, a medical treatment, a fitness program or even political reform. But these are all earthly, finite things. They have not always been, and they surely will not always be! Martin Luther King Jr. said, "We must accept finite disappointment, but never lose infinite hope." There is only One place to find infinite Hope!

- "But those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength. They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary, they will walk and not be faint." Isaiah 40:31
- "For I know the plans I have for you,' declares the Lord, 'plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future." Jeremiah 29:11

Place of Springs

Part of Jewish tradition was to journey (pilgrimage) to the temple for festivals like passover. Psalm 85:5-7 describes what it is like to be one of those people on their journey to the temple.

Blessed are those whose strength is in you, whose hearts are set on pilgrimage.
 As they pass through the Valley of Baka, they make it a place of springs; the autumn rains also cover it with pools.
 They go from strength to strength, till each appears before God in Zion.

The journey to the temple was not easy. They did not relax in their fancy vehicles eating cheeseburgers and a milk shake only to complain at the end of the day of how brutal it was to sit in the vehicle for 10 hours...we never do that right? To journey to the temple was a labor-intensive process and was even dangerous. If you had a beast carry your load, you were fortunate. For many, they had to carry their possessions needed in the sweltering heat of the sun in a dry (borderline desert) region. Often travelers were of age or had family to help along the way. But the journey was important and was not something to skip out on, so people made a way.

Blessed are those on the journey whose strength is found in the Lord! In verse six we read that there was a place called the Valley of Baka (Balsam tree). This was an area that was waterless region, but the Valley of Baka had springs with pools of water. Travelers who were tired and thirsty longed to arrive at this location so that they might be blessed and renewed in their journey to the temple. This place was seen as a blessing from God!

Though we do not physically travel to the temple to be in God's presence, we can see this depicts our journey as followers of Christ! We live each day on earth in this temporary home, headed to the destination of God's blessed presence in eternity. Along this journey, we face the blazing heat of this life, the struggle and hardship. We endure the cold nights. But along the way, God's blessings appear in various forms. A timely word, a season of rest, a relationship that builds you. Seasons of refreshment are a blessing from God! Have you taken time to stop in the Valley of Baca to be renewed or are you so concerned with the destination that you walk right by and put your life in



danger? More than ever, in this season of covid, healthy and renewed christians are so important. We see burnout and frustration on a level that we have never seen before. Nerves are fried from all the worry and many people are depressed and without empathy for others...yet the unending refreshment of the Holy Spirit is available. Is your life characterized by the struggle OR by verse 7? I encourage you, find you strength in the refreshment God offers along the journey and experience what it is like to go from strength to strength till that moment you are in God's presence.



Pastor Carey has served our congregation as a pastor for 29 years! Thank you, Pastor Carey, for your heart for the Lord and your ministry in this church!

The Search Committee began meeting on February 10, 2021; and has met 4 times as of the writing of this article. Here is a short progress report. So far we have:

- reviewed the pastoral search process;
- appointed Search Committee leadership positions (listed above);
- interviewed Associate Pastor Carey Vik to better understand the scope and duties of his position and to receive his insights and recommendations for the position;
- held a Search Committee prayer meeting;
- and began discussion of expectations for the qualifications of the Associate Pastor position.

The Search Committee asks the congregation to be in prayer during this transitional time. Please pray for our church body, the Search Committee members, and for the search process. And please keep the Vik family in prayer as they continue to follow God's lead.

The Search Committee will be opening a period for comments from the congregation on April 11. For those who would like to provide input regarding the search process, we will announce more details regarding an opportunity for congregational input at that time.

Conversations for Congo

March 23, 2021

Therefore, do not be anxious about tomorrow, for tomorrow will be anxious for itself. Sufficient for the day is its own trouble. (Matthew 6:34)

Dear Friends for Congo,

Recently I was reminded that God invites us to a life of insecurity. Or perhaps it is better to say that God invites us to a life of *true* security. Our natural desire is to secure life by our own efforts, but as we quickly discover, we cannot, in the end, control our lives. Whether the threat is "natural" (like COVID, hurricanes, wild fires, or a polar vortex) or man-made (like racial violence or terrorist attacks), we soon find that true security comes only when we trust God, submit to the consequences of our faith, and embrace the responsibility that entails.

I began fund raising in January, 2019, and I have needed to hear Jesus' advice to not be anxious about tomorrow again and again. I have sometimes felt frustrated at my inability to raise funds, but I have always remained secure in my sense of calling and God's faithfulness to provide sufficiently for each day. Last week I finally received confirmation that *my* accumulated and anticipated finances are adequate to begin service. This does not eliminate the need for ongoing fund raising. However, it does signal a change in focus.

My next challenge will be to navigate the administrative, logistical, and health challenges of traveling in this changed world. If those pieces all come together, my hope is to return to Congo in June or July for an exploratory trip before other Covenant groups also begin traveling. My first goal will be to strengthen old relationships, build new ones, and assess the logistical environment for future travel. In the past, a resident missionary staff has assisted in preparing the way for groups visiting northwest Congo, but there are no missionaries in northwest Congo at this time. The Congolese community is a hospitable and generous community, but I hope to add an American perspective as we prepare, together, for visitors.

These next few months will be busy ones for me. In addition to preparing for my own trip, I will become more involved as an intermediary to the Congolese Covenant that is gearing up under a new administration. The installation of President Duale and Vice President Abulu took place on March 14 in the presence of 6,000 people, including both church and government leaders from many parts of Congo. Now they are ready to take action.

Following up from last month, many churches in the break-away regions sent representatives to the installation of President Duale and Vice President Abulu, showing more signs of reconciliation in the midst of continued tension. The trip to remote regions for training in fish culture was a huge success and again contributed to reconciliation efforts. Now emergency aid for refugees along the border has been requested from Covenant World Relief and Development, leading to new opportunities for reconciliation.

Let us not be anxious about tomorrow for there is much yet to do today. Thank you for caring about Congo and about my personal ministry journey. I have posted additional resources and earlier "Conversations" at:



This process will be as follows:

- DRIVE THRU ONLY format so PLEASE REMAIN IN YOUR VEHICLES.
- You will be directed where to line up your vehicle.
- Please ONLY arrive 10 mins before your online registration time slot.
- Registration will begin at 10:00am and will end when all shares have been distributed.
- While you are waiting in line, our volunteers will come to your vehicle to confirm your online registration and put a 1/2 or full sign under your windshield wiper.
- When prompted you will pull your vehicle up the side church doors and volunteers will bring your share(s) to your car and load it into your vehicle.
- PLEASE HAVE **YOUR TRUNK EMPTY AND READY TO RECEIVE THE BOXES** CONTAINING YOUR SHARE. Some things may be boxed, but you should also have an extra empty tub or two in your trunk.
- THE CHURCH BUILDING WILL NOT BE OPEN, however, you may use the restroom.

In light of the current situation, we will be carrying out this distribution with considerably fewer volunteers. Please be patient with this process as we strive to follow CDC guidelines while we help our community to stretch their food budget during this critical time. Should Children Be Kept in the Loop?

During estate or financial planning, the topic often comes up regarding how much to involve children. The question, "Should I share this information with my children?" is an important matter to consider and discuss. There is perhaps no better time to address this than during times of short and/or longrange financial planning. This is when it is most fresh and pertinent in your mind.

How this is handled is different for each family. You are the best one to make this call because of the unique relationship you have with your child(ren). You probably have a good understanding of each of their strengths and weaknesses. You are most familiar with how your children interact with each other and are aware of other dynamics impacting how they may or may not get along. Often during times of health crises or the death of a parent, differences among children are more strongly expressed. For example, if one or both parents' care requires moving them to an assisted living facility, what to do with the existing home can become a tense issue. If children are spread out geographically, these conversations can become even more complicated.

As much as is possible, we have found it helpful to have the child(ren) informed regarding their parents' estate and financial planning decisions and directives. Being proactive and intentional about communicating your wishes and desires to them and sharing relevant information about your plan not only helps them to be as prepared as possible should you need their help in the future, it can also help reduce misunderstanding and potential conflict in a stressful time.

We encourage arranging family meetings from time to time to share and/or update parents' wishes for both the present and future. These meetings are important opportunities for all involved to raise questions, express concerns, and exchange ideas. It is best to have these conversations when a child or children can hear you express your desires. This can help avoid speculation later, especially when emotions may be running ahead of the facts. In an ideal world, this all sounds good, however, there are situations where it is best not to share too much if any information with children. It bears repeating, we believe these decisions ultimately belong to you.
