

"I AM"

Exodus 3:13-15 Moses said to God, "Suppose I go to the Israelites and say to them, 'The God of your fathers has sent me to you,' and they ask me, 'What is his name?' Then what shall I tell them?" God said to Moses, "I AM WHO I AM. This is what you are to say to the Israelites: 'I am has sent me to you." God also said to Moses, "Say to the Israelites, 'The Lord, the God of your fathers -- the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac and the God of Jacob has sent me to you.' "This is my name forever, the name you shall call me from generation to generation."

We are beginning a sermon series on the last day of January 2021 that will go until Palm Sunday in late March. The series is called "I AM" based upon the name God expressed concerning himself in Exodus 3:14-15 and the number of times Jesus is referred to in the Gospel of John as "I AM." Proverbs 9:10a says, "Those who know your name – trust in you!" In this series we are going to learn the Old Testament and New Testament nuances of God's name "I AM," with the goal of growing in our trust in God.

Francis Schaeffer wrote in a famous book in the 1960's: <u>The God Who Is There.</u> In it he said when God says, "I AM WHO I AM" it means: "I am the God who sees and hears, who knows and remembers, who cares and loves. I am the God who has a plan."

If you belong to Jesus, here is the good news: "I AM" is for you. When God told Moses: "You're going to Egypt and basically you're not sure this is going to work. I am telling you all you need to know: My name, I AM WHO I AM." I will be with you! The self-existent, transcendent, God of the universe! "I AM." Is with us!

The Desolation of ...God?!"

Psalm 46:8 "Come and see what the Lord has done, the desolations he has brought on the earth."

"The Desolation of Smaug!" This is the title of the second of the Hobbit movie trilogy, from the book "The Hobbit" written by J.R.R. Tolkien. Yes, another illustration from my favorite movie series, so sorry. In the epic telling of the adventure of Bilbo Baggins, i.e. the Hobbit, he joins up with a band of Dwarves determined to retake their homeland and it's rich hoard of gold from Smaug the dragon. Smaug had swept in many years earlier and destroyed their people and villages and took over the lonely mountain where the king under the hill reigned. They had been exiles ever since. Now they venture back and send Bilboa in to see if Smaug is still there and to find the Arkenstone, the king's jewel for them. Unfortunately, when Smaug is awakened, he incites even further desolation on the people living nearby.

Psalm 46 speaks of the "desolations" that the Lord has brought on the earth! However, unlike Smaug's destruction, God's desolations are our salvation! Verse 9- "He makes wars cease to the ends of the earth. He breaks the bow and shatters the spear; he burns the shields with fire." Verse 6 reveals the chaotic state of the earth as the nations are in uproar. And there will come a day when God will say "enough!" God will desolate the world of self-worship and self-glorification and reveal Himself as the one true God, to be exalted among the nations and in the earth! And then He will say (Verse 10): "Be still and know that I am God…" not you! But to all who are His own He will say — "I AM":

your refuge and strength, ever present help in trouble (vs 1), in the City of God (vs 4-5), sovereign and with you (vs 7), your fortress (vs 7), with you (vs 11).

We are able to live in the presence, the fortress of God, because of the other desolation of God that happened at the cross of Calvary! God's one and only Son Jesus took upon Himself all of our Sin (which was cause for our destruction) and bore our pain, suffering and separation from God for us!

Isaiah 53:4-5 "Surely he took up our pain and bore our suffering, yet we considered him punished by God, stricken by him, and afflicted. But he was pierced for our transgressions, he was crushed for our iniquities; the punishment that brought us peace was on him, and by his wounds we are healed."

The crushing at the Cross brought about the desolation of our sin! This is the desolation of God! The world can only destroy itself, but God can destroy what destroys us! God's desolation is our salvation when we put our hope and faith in Jesus, and Jesus alone! God is our refuge and strength, the God who is present with us even though the earth give way!

Psalm 46:4-5 "There is a river whose streams make glad the city of God, the holy place where the Most High dwells. God is within her, she will not fall."



Sally was a missionary with the Evangelical Covenant Church to the





Dear friends at Mission Covenant,

The start of a New Year is a good time to pause and thank you for your gifts in recent months. A year ago I felt paralyzed as my support was slipping after so many years in Africa. I didn't want to mention it to anyone. I was in a bind being so close to retirement and needing just a bit more to push me over the finish line. I mentioned the need in my letter last March, and was amazed and grateful to see how many friends responded immediately. My monthly support strengthened, and some significant gifts will carry me through to the end. I will retire the first of September 2021. The last four months I will be in the States for a Home Assignment giving me the chance to visit my supporters and churches to thank them for their partnership with me over the years. I look forward to seeing you soon.

With so many expressions on social media of relief that 2020 is behind us, we sound like we think 2021 will be better. But in cultivating an attitude of gratitude, I admit that 2020 was a good year for me. Someone asked recently that if I possessed today everything that I thanked the Lord for yesterday, what would I have?

I'm so thankful that I have my health. A year ago I spent three days in the ICU and was on medicine for six months. Now I'm all better! Yay, 2020! A year ago I was weary of near constant travel in 2019. This past year I could be home! Yay 2020! A couple years ago I was frustrated with an internet connection that sorta worked. Now it's much better. Yay 2020! A year ago my mother was quite ill, but now she is well again. I talk with her every week. Yay 2020! Some aspects of my work have lagged under the Covid restrictions, but other points have flourished, particularly regular contact with my Ministry Area Leaders via Zoom. We made progress in training for better accountability. Yay 2020!

I'll admit that the isolation of the first two months, when South Africa was under total lockdown, I struggled. Fortunately my friends Jurg and Minda van Dyk sensed that I wasn't doing well, so in May and June they invited me over each week for coffee or a meal. My best memory of 2020 was spending a wintery Sunday afternoon in front of their fireplace. I wish I had thought to take a picture. I should have framed it.

The crowning glory was the opportunity to visit Chad again, to meet again my Chadian colleagues, to thank them for their love and care for me in years past, to pray with them and commit them into the hand of God.

At the end of the day, it's all about relationships. So many dear friends have ministered to me in the past and in recent days. I know that our care for one another glorifies our Lord since we are his hands and feet in this world. This year forced us to rethink a lot of things. I ended it being very thankful, forever grateful for God's grace and the goodness of his people.

Thank you for your generous gifts to me this past year totalling \$8,875. I'm very thankful that you have continued your support during this difficult year of 2020. These remaining months will fly by and I'll soon be seeing you again. May the Lord bless you and sustain you in this New Year 2021.

We will continue our SOS Foodshare distribution the same as we have the past 3 months with *ONLINE PURCHASES- see link below* and it will be a *DRIVE THRU ONLY service*, where guests will stay in their vehicles and shares will be brought out and loaded into your vehicle by our volunteers.

This process will be as follows:

- DRIVE THRU ONLY format so PLEASE REMAIN IN YOUR VEHICLES.
- You will be directed where to line up your vehicle.
- Please ONLY arrive 10 mins before your online registration time slot.
- Registration will begin at 10:00am and will end when all shares have been distributed.
- While you are waiting in line, our volunteers will come to your vehicle to confirm your online registration and put a 1/2 or full sign under your windshield wiper.
- When prompted you will pull your vehicle up the side church doors and volunteers will bring your share(s) to your car and load it into your vehicle.
- PLEASE HAVE **YOUR TRUNK EMPTY AND READY TO RECEIVE THE BOXES** CONTAINING YOUR SHARE. Some things may be boxed, but you should also have an extra empty tub or two in your trunk.
- THE CHURCH BUILDING WILL NOT BE OPEN, however, you may use the restroom.

In light of the current situation, we will be carrying out this distribution with considerably fewer volunteers. Please be patient with this process as we strive to follow CDC guidelines while we help our community to stretch their food budget during this critical time. We are hopeful that with a little patience and understanding we can make this a safe and successful distribution for those that participate.
