

#### **Understanding the Times**

In 1 Chronicles 12, shortly after David had become king in Israel many warriors and fighting men were coming alongside David as he was shoring up the nation of Israel, its capital city of Jerusalem and its borders. Verse 23 lists the numbers of men around for battle who came to David at Hebron to turn Saul's kingdom over to David, as the Lord had said. Among them verse 32 teaches there were men from Issachar, who understood the times and knew what Israel should do.

The Book of Ephesians references something very similar in chapter five verses fifteen and sixteen where it says, "Be very careful, then, how you live-not as unwise, but as wise, making the most of every opportunity, because the days are evil."

Philip Reiff an American sociologist and cultural critic wrote a seminal work in 1966. The book was entitled, "The Triumph of the Therapeutic." In it he said the death of God in the west had given birth to a new civilization devoted to liberating the individual to seek his own pleasures and to managing emergent anxieties. The religious man, who had lived according to belief in transcendent principles that ordered life around communal purposes, gave way to the psychological man, who believed that there was no transcendent order and that life's purpose was to find one's own way experimentally. Man no longer understood himself to be a pilgrim on a meaningful journey with others, but as a tourist who traveled through life according to his own self-designed itinerary, with perpetual happiness his ultimate goal.

Reiff foresaw the future of religion as devolution into watery spirituality, which could accommodate anything. In 2005, sociologists of religion Christian Smith and Melinda Lundquist Denton coined the phrase "Moralistic Therapeutic Deism" to describe this decadent form of Christianity. A belief that God exists and wants nothing more from us than to be nice and happy.

Thus, in our new therapeutic culture, which is triumphing everywhere, the great sin is to stand in the way of freedom of others to find happiness as they wish. This new philosophy goes hand in hand with the sexual revolution along with ethnic and gender identity politics. Along with this is the "Transgender Phenomenon" which requires affirming psychology over biological reality.

Rod Dreher writes in his book, "Live Not by Lies," that Christian resistance on a large scale to these culture shifts has been fruitless. Why, because the spirit of the therapeutic has conquered many churches as well, even those populated by Christians who identified as conservative. He says, "very few contemporary Christians are prepared to suffer for their faith because the therapeutic society is so deeply formed in them. Such a belief denies the purpose of suffering in the first place. The idea of bearing pain for the sake of truth just seems so ridiculous."

It is important that we understand the times we are living in and make the most of our opportunities because the days are evil.



#### **Associate Pastor Search Committee Update**

The Associate Pastor of Worship position remains posted until September 15, 2021 which means we are about one third of the way through the period of accepting applicants. As of the time of writing this article, we have received four applications. So far, we have not received any applications through CovConnect, which provides contacts with credentialed pastors already serving within the Evangelical Covenant Church. We do consider some of the applicants to have strong potential and anticipate conducting at least one interview in August.

I want to encourage anyone reading this update to pause in this moment to pray over the search process and for Mission Covenant Church (MCC). Here are a few prayer prompts:

- \* Thank God for what He has done at MCC and how you see Him at work here
- \* Ask God what He has in store for MCC—to open your eyes and heart to His vision for our congregation and community
- \* Talk to God about the kind of person you want to see as a leader of worship and missions, teacher, and pastor at MCC
- Pray for God to send applicants who will meet the needs of MCC and be welcomed into our community
- \* Ask God what changes He is asking you personally—and our congregation as a body—to make to follow Him
- \* Ask God how He wants to use you to build up the body of Christ at MCC
- \* Ask God to protect and uphold those in leadership at MCC and on the Search Committee
- \* Pray that the Committee would listen for God's direction and guidance in every decision and listen well to each other

Righteous Rabbit Trails.

A Sunday conversation group

O LORD, LISTEN TO MY CRY; GIVE ME THE DISCERNING MIND YOU PROMISED." PSALM 119:169

What is in a name? I chose the name "Righteous Rabbit Trails" to describe the type of discussion group I would like to see develop. Throughout my time as a Christian and in ministry, I have led many Bible study and topical study groups. Many of them used a well-defined curriculum. The studies had a linear aspect moving along in an orderly fashion to a predetermined end. Occasionally the group would get off track, and the discussion would focus on something, perhaps related, but all-together different from the plan for that meeting. I call these diversions "Rabbit Trails." Over the years I have noticed that often when we have been on these "Rabbit Trails," God is at work in the heart and mind of someone seeking an answer to one of life's big questions. I think it is exciting to be a part of a group when God is at work and someone takes a step closer to being at home with God, so the whole point of the group is to get at the questions and fears that hinder the development and deepening of your faith and its application to life today.

Where do you turn to find the answers to life's big questions? Sadly, for most of us the first place we turn is Google. Sometimes we never even get to the big questions because our media and the academy have already told us what the answers are. But I would point you to Phillippians 2:12 where Paul tells us to "continue to work out your salvation with fear and trembling." Ultimately it falls to each of us to find the answers to life's big questions for ourselves. So what do we do?

When I was in seminary, there were a number of Methodists studying with me. Have you ever wondered where Methodists got their name? That's right, the Wesley brothers developed a method to find the answers to life's big questions. This method based its teaching on four sources as the basis for finding truth, God's Will. These four sources are Scripture, tradition, reason, and Christian experience, with Scripture above all else. If you ask, very few Methodists know anything about the method. But, there is something to the method, so I propose we use it to find those big answers. I need you to reason with me, to share your understanding of the tradition of the Evangelical Covenant Church and the greater Church, share your Christian experience and pour over the Scripture with me.

The sermon series "Courageous Christianity" is finished, but the discussion goes on. Righteous rabbit Trails will continue as long as there is interest. So, I invite you to join me in discussion of God's call to us to be "Salt and Light" in our world. There is so much to talk about, current events, theology, our personal experience of God and His word, family, gifts of the spirit and so much more. I look forward to seeing you Sunday evenings, 6:30 at the church.

We will continue our SOS Foodshare distribution the same as we have the past 3 months with *ONLINE PURCHASES- see link below* and it will be a *DRIVE THRU ONLY service*, where guests will stay in their vehicles and shares will be brought out and loaded into your vehicle by our volunteers.

#### This process will be as follows:

- DRIVE THRU ONLY format so PLEASE REMAIN IN YOUR VEHICLES.
- You will be directed where to line up your vehicle.
- Please ONLY arrive 10 mins before your online registration time slot.
- Registration will begin at 10:00 a.m. and will end when all shares have been distributed.
- While you are waiting in line, our volunteers will come to your vehicle to confirm your online registration and put a 1/2 or full sign under your windshield wiper.
- When prompted you will pull your vehicle up the side church doors and volunteers will bring your share(s) to your car and load it into your vehicle.
- PLEASE HAVE **YOUR TRUNK EMPTY AND READY TO RECEIVE THE BOXES** CONTAINING YOUR SHARE. Some things may be boxed, but you should also have an extra empty tub or two in your trunk.
- THE CHURCH BUILDING WILL NOT BE OPEN; however, you may use the restroom.

In light of the current situation, we will be carrying out this distribution with considerably fewer volunteers. Please be patient with this process as we strive to follow CDC guidelines while we help our community to stretch their food budget during this critical time. We are hopeful that with a little patience and understanding we can make this a safe and successful distribution for those that participate.
