I Thessalonians 5:15-18 states; make sure that nobody pays back wrong for wrong, but always strive to do what is good for each other and for everyone else. Rejoice always, pray continually, give thanks in all circumstances, for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus.

Sit with this passage for a while and reflect on what it is saying. Do the right thing in every situation for everyone! Rejoice and pray on an ongoing basis and give thanks in all circumstances. Does this mean during all the social unrest going on within our nation right now and all the expected unrest that will result after November 3, 2020? Does this mean giving thanks as well during the contentious political times we find ourselves living in. The Bible teaches to "give thanks in all circumstances," not just the ones we like or the ones that are favorable to us. And by the way, this is not some kind of thin spirituality either or blind faith that denies reality. It is honest regarding life in this fallen world and the God we serve who is "able to do immeasurably more than we could ever think or ask."

Thanks-giving is never based upon circumstances, rather it is based upon the God we serve! Happy Thanksgiving to all of you!

"There's Another in the Fire" Hillsong Music

There was another in the fire
Standing next to me
There was another in the waters
Holding back the seas
And should I ever need reminding
Of how I've been set free
There is a cross that bears the burden
Where another died for me

God's presence! God's present(s)! As in gift to us, but also as in "right here, right now" present! Immanuel-God with us! He is with us, with you! Do you experience His presence? When do you notice it...or remember (what reminds you of) His presence? Is it clear; is His company poignant?! Or is it more of a mundane non-explosive, "I hope He's there" thing?

I love to spend time with my wife Jennifer! We have been married for 30 years and 90 days, and the room still lights up when she is with me! I look forward to coming home and being together! I miss her terribly when we are apart! When she is there...wherever I am...her presence is unmistakable, undeniable, unavoidable (and that's a good thing!) and most desirable! It doesn't matter if things are going good or bad, I want her to be with me!

So...do I (we) crave God's presence like that?? Do we notice Him and expect Him with that kind of joy?! Honestly, I struggle to experience God like that in the daily routine. It is not that He is not poignant...or present...He does not change! But I feel like we don't look for or expect Him unless there's trouble! There have been certain (non-trouble) experiences in my life where God's presence was explosive and invigorating, when I felt like I could reach out and physically take His hand (sort of) and audibly hear His voice! But that is the exception rather than what I wish was the norm. I wonder (squirrel!) if the furnace thing was a big surprise to Shadrach, Meshack and Abednego?!

These guys had been ripped from what I would perceive to have been an OK life situation before the Babylonians stepped in. King Nezzer besieged Jerusalem and took captive men like these three: "from the royal family and the nobility—young men without any physical defect, handsome, showing aptitude for every kind of learning, well informed, quick to understand, and qualified to serve in the king's palace" (Daniel 1). They were the best of the best (by the worlds standards) now dislodged from their lives (from wealthy important families) and transplanted in an enemy kings court, trained for 3 years in Babylon's paganism and for the Kings pleasure. Obviously, we don't know for sure what their relationship with God was like back in Jerusalem when life was good. But I am inclined to think that their steadfast faith throughout this ordeal may be evidence of a spiritual foundation formed earlier. And now, when they are faced with the punishment of death (if they will not bow down to the Kings golden statue of himself and worship him rather than God) they do not seem to flinch even a bit!

There are so many details I wish we knew more about in this story, but I think this is the point: they did what they did and lived like they lived because they knew God had been with them in the past, was with them in the present, and would be with them when it was over whether or not He delivered them from the effects of the flames! "King Nebuchadnezzar, we do not need to defend ourselves before you in this matter. ¹⁷ If we are thrown into the blazing furnace, the God we serve is able to deliver us from it, and he will deliver us from Your Majesty's hand. ¹⁸ But even if he does not, we want you to know, Your Majesty, that we will not serve your gods or worship the image of gold you have set up" (Daniel 3:16-18). And so they were thrown in. No mention of a scuffle or resistance. No one yelled "youre gonna regret this Nezzer!!" Did they even have the thought to text "I love you!" to their family because they might not ever come home again?? Did anyone scream, "What about Daniel????" And here is the kicker: when the writer states that king Nebuchadnezzar sees 4 figures walking around in the fire, they are just WALKING around.

Ok, so this is what I'm getting at: they acted like they were not surprised to see Jesus there with them! I know, we have no idea what they were talking about or how it was being said, but...I am fairly certain that if the physical

presence of God showed up in my "fire" I would be either jumping up and down screaming or passed out on the ground!! I have this nagging perception (mis-perception) that those things happened only in Bible days, and we must muddle through our lives with a "distant" God (well sure He loves us and is "with" us, but He probably won't show up like He did back then)? I mean, I watch a lot of different people who are in the midst of their "fire" right now and it seems like they are getting burned; feeling the pain and losing the battle. Rack, Shak and Benny came out without even the smell of smoke! Happy dance!!!! C'mon, they must have at least done a happy dance! God was present with them in a miraculous, pain saving way!

But...Life, and TRUTH, the Gospel and God's plan are not at all revealed, affirmed or fulfilled based on my perceptions, or experience (pain or joy etc), desires, outcomes or even beliefs! What is Real, True and Right (eous) is found only in God Himself! He never changes, and we must change our thoughts and lives to align with Who He Is...and He is always (omni) present with us, fire or no fire!

- Psalm 139:6-8 "Such knowledge is too wonderful for me, too lofty for me to attain. Where can I go from your Spirit? Where can I flee from your presence? If I go up to the heavens, you are there; if I make my bed in the depths, you are there."
- Deuteronomy 31:8 "The Lord himself goes before you and will be with you; he will never leave you nor forsake you. Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged."

God parted the waters for Moses and Israel to provide them safety and deliverance, but He also sent the disciples into a stormy sea while He went up a mountainside alone to pray, and didn't come to them walking on the water ready to calm the wind until several hours of struggling and fear had occurred!

God allowed Satan to destroy most of what Job had and loved in this world, yet Jesus drove demons out of the people He met along the way.

God rescued Rack, Shack and Benny from the fire in a miraculous way, yet millions of Christians have died for their faith including the Jews that Nero burned in AD 66, the Jews killed by Hitler and the Nazis and so many others all around the world!

These are not contradictions exposing a fickle god. They reveal Truth and a God we cannot put in a mold. We cannot define God by our circumstances, we must define our circumstances by knowing we have a faithful and everpresent God! One shoe does not fit everyone and every circumstance. In fact, God's plan has no shoes. Well, the armor of God has shoes fitted with the readiness of the Gospel! Put those on! Our righteousness does not protect our physical body or anything else really, but His righteousness protects our eternal heart! His salvation is our helmet! His Word is our offensive weapon! And mustard seed faith puts out the evil one's flaming arrows! When we are suited up in Christ, we can head into the fire or water or battle and we will be ok, even if we are not delivered from the fire!

I don't know how God will work in your fire, but I know He is in there with you! You are not alone if you know Jesus as your Messiah, your Savior! Have you confessed that you are a sinner that desperately needs to be forgiven and saved? If you have been trying to face the fire alone, don't! Give it all to the one Who wants to step into your life, fire or water or whatever, and lead you through it!

Let's remember, surrender, and not be surprised by Immanuel, God WITH us! There's another in the fire!

HIS GLORY

Have you ever wondered what God looks like in all His glory?

I often think about this and long for the day when my faith will become sight! In scripture there are several instances where humans can see a visible manifestation of God's presence. In all of these cases there was a limitation to what the humans could see or experience about God. Fast forward to when Jesus came to the earth, he put his glory to the side and humbled himself (Philippians 2:7), but interestingly there is one moment that humans got a glimpse of his glory, an event called the transfiguration. In Luke 9:27 Jesus tells his disciples that "some who are standing here will not taste death before they see the kingdom of God." 8 days later Peter, James, and John witnessed Jesus' appearance glow like lightening (v.29) as well as see Moses and Elijah appear in "glorious splendor". Apart from this moment, Jesus looked like any other man during his years on earth. He had none of the brilliant glory associated with God in the Old Testament (Exodus 40:34). It is humbling to know that the God we serve possess all power and glory yet Jesus did not use that power to his own advantage but humbled himself "by taking on the very nature of a servant" in human likeness (Phil 2:6-7). During these difficult days we are living in, remember that our God is all powerful and yet was willing to becoming human ...and because of that, we have the opportunity to some day stand in his presence and enjoy the fullness of His glory without shame. What a day that will be!

Our prayer is that as you focus on Jesus this Christmas season and your joy will be full!


Library Lines

Sharing One's SurplusSaturday, November 14



We will continue our SOS Foodshare distribution the same as we have the past 3 months with *ONLINE PURCHASES- see link below* and it will be a *DRIVE THRU ONLY service*, where guests will stay in their vehicles and shares will be brought out and loaded into your vehicle by our volunteers.

This process will be as follows:

- DRIVE THRU ONLY format so PLEASE REMAIN IN YOUR VEHICLES.
- You will be directed where to line up your vehicle.
- Please ONLY arrive 10 mins before your online registration time slot.
- Registration will begin at 10:00am and will end when all shares have been distributed.
- While you are waiting in line, our volunteers will come to your vehicle to confirm your online registration and put a 1/2 or full sign under your windshield wiper.
- When prompted you will pull your vehicle up the side church doors and volunteers will bring your share(s) to your car and load it into your vehicle.
- PLEASE HAVE **YOUR TRUNK EMPTY AND READY TO RECEIVE THE BOXES** CONTAINING YOUR SHARE. Some things may be boxed, but you should also have an extra empty tub or two in your trunk.
- THE CHURCH BUILDING WILL NOT BE OPEN, however, you may use the restroom.

In light of the current situation, we will be carrying out this distribution with considerably fewer volunteers. Please be patient with this process as we strive to follow CDC guidelines while we help our community to stretch their food budget during this critical time. We are hopeful that with a little patience and understanding we can make this a safe and successful distribution for those that participate.
