# Matthew 1:18-25 Such a Strange Way...

Maybe it's just me, but it seems like God does some pretty bizarre things (human perspective contemplating the Divine). After considering all the strange people God used to establish His chosen people, Israel, He becomes one of them! He becomes one of us! Think about that! The creator and sustainer of all things created man in His own image, and then... well then He becomes Himself the created!!?? Mind blown! How does the Potter become the clay? How can Mary give birth to the One who created her and designed her in her own mother's womb and also become her Savior?

And it doesn't stop there (more human controversy thrown into the incarnation); Mary is not married! Yes they are legally bound together in their engagement according to Jewish law and customs, but the wedding had not happened yet and being pregnant out of wedlock was punishable (according to Jewish law) by stoning!

This reminds me (spin cycle) of Jesus' words to His disciples concerning the rich young ruler. When this young man asked Jesus what he must do to inherit eternal life, Jesus hit on the area of struggle in his life when He answered him "Sell your possessions and give to the poor... then come follow me" (Mat 19). The young ruler walked away sad because he was filthy rich! Jesus' told His disciples that it is harder for a rich man to enter heaven than for a camel to go through the eye of a needle! "Well, how in the world can anyone be saved then" the disciples asked (Vik paraphrase)? Jesus' answer to them helps us as we think about the incarnation. Jesus answered them, "With man this is impossible, but with God all things are possible" (Mat 19:26).

Mary faced a seemingly impossible situation, but she knew God's voice well enough to hear and trust. Joseph was also in a very difficult predicament. We don't know much about Joseph (I wish we did), but we read he was a righteous man and he listened to the angel God sent to him. To us the incarnation is a seemingly impossible situation; God becoming man! But it is exactly how He intended to accomplish

His plan to redeem us all. It flies in the face of our understanding, our ability to comprehend and is just not logical! And that is how we can know it was God!!

I think that is the lesson for us today; to be close enough to God in our daily walk with Him that we know His voice and trust His will and follow HIm even if He says we should give everything away to do so! So go and live like Jesus is really the One who can save you (Jesus means Jehovah saves)! No matter what you do He will always be with you (Immanuel-God with us)! And if the One who saves you is always with you, nothing He asks you to do will be impossible!

# Lonely Times. Lonely People

We are now entering the 10-month mark in this pandemic. Something that has become apparent...covid is not the only form of a pandemic we are facing! Many people are lonelier now than they have ever been. Extroverts and introverts alike are all struggling to find connection. Some families didn't gather for the holidays, youth have not been able to see their friends with no school, jobs have been lost, marriages have been tested, and Church families distanced. Nearly everything we love and have come to know is no longer the same and the results are widespread loneliness. To know and be known is a God given desire, in fact God tells us in Genesis 2:18 when he made Adam that it is "not good for man to be alone." God saw that loneliness wasn't good and sought to do something about it through creating Eve which led to a growing population of humans. God did not eradicate loneliness, but he offered a better solution to the problem. He knew that Adam was not designed to be alone...and deep down whether introverted or extroverted, we all realize that loneliness is a problem.

With that said, how can we stay healthy and connected during this time of rampant loneliness?

## 1. Foster an intimate relationship with Jesus Christ. (Psalm 63:1-11)

- Our greatest needs must be fulfilled in our Lord and Savior, so saturate yourself into that essential relationship.

### 2. Make it a priority to connect AND reach out

- There are so many ways that we can connect despite a pandemic. I am reminded of some of our seniors that call each other every day...there is so much wisdom in them doing this! Not only are these people able to connect with each other, they know that someone is going to check in on them. This helps greatly to meet our needs of knowing and being known. Get creative! Find ways to make it a priority...and don't forget to reach out to others because your thoughts and words and actions towards others may be the very thing they needed to get through that day. It also might be the very thing that you need too!

### 3. Pray & Worship

- This goes hand in hand with point #1, but I want to clearly emphasize this! Think of the life of David, constantly he is crying out to the Lord in his discouragement, loneliness, and fear. He would worship God in song. He suffered the hardship of lost/distanced relationships. He suffered being hunted by a blood hungry king. He suffered the emotional struggle of the unknowns in life....yet he would turn to God in prayer and worship! Recently I heard a person say that they have been listening to christian radio/worship songs because in that time God supplies them with peace that overcomes their anxiety. Worship and prayer are powerful tools you have to combat against the loneliness you feel. Be sure to participate in our worship services.

### 4. Seek help

- If loneliness is consuming you and your life, do not hesitate to reach out for help whether that be us as staff, your close friends, a mentor or even a counselor. All of us need help to deal with the situations we face and there is no shame in seeking out help.

### 5. Serve and bless others

- Some of the greatest joy we experience in life is found not in self serving but in serving and blessing others! Make that a priority!

The Christmas Eve Love Offering this year is going to Support Jitokeze Wamama Wafrika In Kapenguria, Kenya. You may remember that a group of 9 from Mission Covenant left on June 6, 2019 for the sole purpose of building a relationship with this training center of women in rural

Kenya. Situated just a few kilometers from the

border with Uganda, Jitokeze works to strengthen women and their families.

# The Jitokeze Mission

We seek to empower marginalized and vulnerable girls and women in West Pokot Kenya to overcome poverty and improve their resilience to the impacts of climate change as well as contribute to building sustainable communities where they dwell.

In Kenya, women are almost a substandard class. Jitokeze serves girls who have suffered harmful cultural



practices like Female Genital Mutilation, early marriages and are denied access to education just because they were born girls.

These practices lock girls and their children in the cycle of poverty and make them highly vulnerable to harsh realities like violation, unemployment, food insecurity and conflict.

Our goal this year is to raise \$13,000 for this offering. That amount is broken down with \$3000 going to purchase fabric so

they can make sanitary napkins. This will be a new project for the center. Finally, the \$10,000 donation will offset costs at the school so that they can continue the work that they are doing teaching food security

through growing crops, sewing and tailoring and other life skills many of us take for granted.

As we end out 2020, please plan on joining us to support Jitokeze and the girls of West Pokot County Kenya.







Psalm 16:11b states, "in Your presence is fullness of joy". Why do I think that is true?

First, when we are in God's presence our focus is changed. We are seeking His face and rather than focusing on the problems that surround us. A great activity is to write out the letters of the alphabet and then record an attribute or character trait of God for each letter. Whether it is His love, goodness, holiness, righteousness, sovereignty, tenderness, etc. you will find an attribute to meet any of your needs.

Second, when we are in God's presence our priorities are changed. We no longer seek self-satisfying activities but our delight and desire is to please and honor God.

One more reason I believe we have *fullness* of joy is that God does not do anything halfway. God Who lavishes His love on us and gives wisdom generously will gladly indulge us in fullness of joy!

The coming of Christ at Christmas opened the way for us to enjoy God's presence so thus the theme of Christmas Joy for our would-be Christmas event. The planning of our event took many twists and turns and many of the ideas were great in theory but difficult in reality. Since our in-person event and even the recording of a program was not possible, I asked Michelle Thompson to share her thoughts on Christmas Joy with us via the newsletter.

# Christmas Joy

The world in which we live is filled with so much uncertainty, fear, and political division, that when I turn on the television or look at social media, I feel as though I'm drinking from a firenose of bad news. When society's overwhelming stress combines with our personal struggles, this results in some of the greatest trials--the likes of which I have not experienced in my life. I was thinking that in my 42 years the only time I have seen the U.S. in this kind of agony was after 9/11. That was horrible, and everyone was impacted by it.

The difference between 2011 and 2020 is that during the tragedy of 9/11, the U.S. was UNITED; now we face great DIVISIONS combined with ISOLATION. The combination of division and isolation can be so unsettling and can instill havoc on a person mentally and emotionally. What can we do when so much of this is out of our control? Christmas is coming, and it's the happiest time of the year, yet the backdrop is mostly bad news.


As Christians we must keep looking to God and anchor ourselves in the **Good News** He has given us in Jesus Christ. Christmas is God's gift to us--His Son. The long-awaited Messiah came to bring salvation and make forgiveness possible, restoring our relationship with God. Thanks to God's provision of a Savior, the division and isolation between God and mankind is gone! When we believe in truth, we are united and connected with God; our hearts can be filled with a sense of comfort and joy that can surpass the chaos around us.

In the Christmas story, the angels had a great role in helping us understand what the birth of Jesus Christ meant and why it brings Joy. First the angel Gabriel appeared to Zechariah, letting him know that he would have a son who would make ready a people prepared for the Lord (Luke 1:17). At first, he did not believe, but later Zechariah came to believe. Scripture tells us the Holy Spirit came to Zechariah, and he prophesied regarding his son John (the Baptist):

<sup>76</sup> And you, my child, will be called a prophet of the Most High; for you will go on before the Lord to prepare the way for him, <sup>77</sup> to give his people the knowledge of salvation through the forgiveness of their sins, <sup>78</sup> because of the tender mercy of our God, by which the rising sun will come to us from heaven <sup>79</sup> to shine on those living in darkness" and in the shadow of death, to guide our feet into the path of peace." (Luke 1:77-78)

This prophecy provided the knowledge that Jesus, the Author of Salvation, was coming. I am in awe of this passage, thinking of how God puts all things perfectly together for His people, even in the detail of preparing hearts. What joy we have when we meditate on God's salvation plan, His mercy, His desire for us to be reconciled to Him, walking in the light and experiencing peace! Though the darkness of troubles can seem overwhelming, Jesus' light is greater, and He is our guide, that brings me GREAT JOY.

The messages continued when the angel Gabriel came to Mary, letting her know she was going to have a baby. He would be called Great, the Son of the Most High, and His kingdom would never end (Luke 1:31). This news was shocking and created hard circumstances for Mary; she accepted God's will and trusted Him to work it out. Then an angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph, letting him know it was ok to take Mary as his wife; Jesus would save His people from their sin, and He would be called Immanuel, "God with Us" (Matthew 1:21, 23). When Joseph was faced with hard decisions, he obeyed God's will and took Mary as his wife. The Jewish people were living in hard times, longing for Messiah to come, and God was faithful to His promise. Remember the angel appeared to the shepherds, saying, "I bring you good tidings of great joy, which shall be to all people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, which is Christ the Lord" (Luke 2:10). God announced to the lowly shepherds the wonders of His compassion and mercy plan for us. We can take to heart the love God has for us that cannot be stopped, even when times are hard. The birth of Jesus is designed to bring us great joy. When our outward circumstances are in times of turmoil, we can rest in what we know to be true. Seek truth when you are hurting by reading God's word; pray for His strength to hold you up, and continue to lift your eyes to Jesus with a thankful heart for His love and sacrifice. May the peace of God, which transcends all understanding guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus (Philippians 4:7), and may the joy of salvation sustain you now and forever. Merry Christmas!





# **Sharing One's Surplus**Saturday, December 12



We will continue our SOS Foodshare distribution the same as we have the past 3 months with *ONLINE PURCHASES- see link below* and it will be a *DRIVE THRU ONLY service*, where guests will stay in their vehicles and shares will be brought out and loaded into your vehicle by our volunteers.

# This process will be as follows:

- DRIVE THRU ONLY format so PLEASE REMAIN IN YOUR VEHICLES.
- You will be directed where to line up your vehicle.
- Please ONLY arrive 10 mins before your online registration time slot.
- Registration will begin at 10:00am and will end when all shares have been distributed.
- While you are waiting in line, our volunteers will come to your vehicle to confirm your online registration and put a 1/2 or full sign under your windshield wiper.
- When prompted you will pull your vehicle up the side church doors and volunteers will bring your share(s) to your car and load it into your vehicle.
- PLEASE HAVE **YOUR TRUNK EMPTY AND READY TO RECEIVE THE BOXES** CONTAINING YOUR SHARE. Some things may be boxed, but you should also have an extra empty tub or two in your trunk.
- THE CHURCH BUILDING WILL NOT BE OPEN, however, you may use the restroom.

In light of the current situation, we will be carrying out this distribution with considerably fewer volunteers. Please be patient with this process as we strive to follow CDC guidelines while we help our community to stretch their food budget during this critical time. We are hopeful that with a little patience and understanding we can make this a safe and successful distribution for those that participate.

# Things to do before the new year

With 2021 just around the corner, now is a good time to review a few important financial matters.

# 1. Have you made your IRA contributions for the year?

You have until April 15 of 2021 to make your contribution for 2020, but there is no time like the present to move funds into your IRA. You can increase your tax deferred position and get the funds working for you as soon as possible. The contribution limit for 2020 is \$6,000 and if you are over 50, the IRS allows you to contribute an additional \$1,000 to your IRA as a "catch up."

### 2. Wondering about taking your RMD?

Normally we would take this opportunity to remind those of you required to take a minimum distribution from your IRA, 401(k) or 403(b) to get that done prior to year-end. Due to the CARES Act, however, there is no requirement to take an RMD in 2020. You can skip the RMD for 2020 if you choose. This includes those individuals who turned 70½ years of age in 2019 and had to take their first RMD by April 1, 2020.

### 3. Have you completed your charitable giving?

A gift of appreciated securities is a good idea, both for the donor and the recipient, and with the stock market up, the timing could be right. If you are making cash donations to qualified public charities, remember that the CARES Act increased the individual limits to 100% of your adjusted gross income. Remember to get a receipt from the charity.

4. When is the last time you reviewed your estate plan and beneficiary designations? Has there been a new arrival in your family? Did your children become adults? Has there been a marriage or divorce? Did someone pass away? If you have experienced any of these changes, it is time to look at the beneficiaries under your will, trust, IRA, company retirement plan and insurance policies. You want to make sure all documents are up to date and reflect your current wishes.
